Among the lavish dark wood and gold themed guest rooms are two Atelier suites, hosting artists in residence throughout the year. Spend the day taking in pieces by featured artists, including photography by Julia Calfee and Marcos Lopez.



Rich color schemes of deep red, gold and dark wood give each guest suite a signature 'Jacques Garcia' look. The luxury continues to the features and furnishings, including sumptuous pillows and indulgent Etro bath products. Designed to put each guest in touch with their cultural surrounds, the rooms include mini bars stocked with artisanal delicacies.



Step outside Hotel Vagabond and you'll be in Kampong Glam. The heartland of the city's Malay community, this bustling quarter offers a vibrant mix of traditional and contemporary Singapore. Stroll along Bussorah Street, with its quirky boutiques and handicraft shops, to the gold domed Sultan Mosque. Stop off at a street stall for an authentic taste of South-east Asian cuisine. Or visit the Malay Heritage Centre to discover the stories of Sultans from centuries past. Then rest tired feet at a local café and savour a rich, fresh coffee.

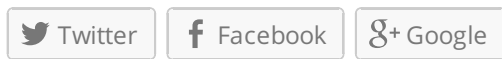
